

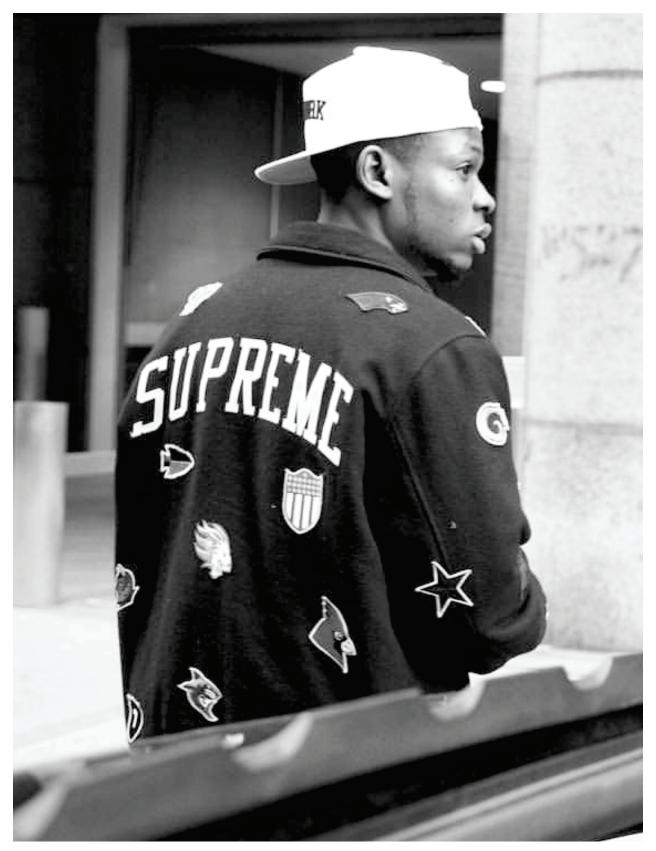

SIMPLICITY IS KEY IN FASHION

PRINCE MICHAEL ATOBATELE INTERVIEW WITH E24-7 MAGAZINE (Published Sept. 4th 2016)]



Prince Michael Babatunde Atobatele is at an age when he should be fascinated by sexy girls, gadgets and fast cars, but the 22 year old graduate of Business and Human Resource Management from the University of Hertfordshire is more interested in laying a solid foundation for his life. In this chat with E24,-7 MAGAZINE'S NEWS EDITOR, TOFARATI IGE, he talks about his business, Severe Nature and other issues. Excerpts...

Tell us about your company, Severe Nature?

Well, we're just a group of individuals that share the same vision and passion for fashion, and we thought about how we can project this to reality; that's how we came about the brand. Severe Nature is like a darker side to nature and it was established in 2012. We started with prints on quality material, and in 2014, we went into embroidered logos, stitches and other things ... basically luxury street wear.

Severe Nature's Pop Shop in Lagos

Tell us more about the people you work with at Severe Nature?

The Creative Director of the brand is Babatunde Christopher Afolabi and he is based in Canada. He is the one who started the brand and then called us together. We also have people like Tobi Adeleye; and in the UK, we have Mubarak Olapade who is the co-director.

Have you always had a thing for fashion?

Yes, I and my friends have always had a thing for fashion.

So why didn't you study something related to fashion?

My parents thought I should study something broader than fashion that will allow me to do fashion as well as other things. I'm also thinking of studying a course in fashion to understand some things. Not the designing part though, but the actual fashion business.

Your mom is also into fashion; did you get your love for fashion from her?

Yes, I think, and my dad is also into fashion as well. When I was young, my dad always got me good designer stuff whenever he went on holidays. From there, I got enthusiastic about fashion and I always researched online to see the story of the brands to have an idea of what they're all about.

What's your target market?

Our target market is definitely the youths.

How were you able to get funding to start this?

The parents of Chris, our Creative Director, really believed in his idea so they helped to fund the most part of it. We also told our individual parents about it, and they helped us as well, but most of it was from Chris' parents.

How has business been?

Business has been very good. We've worked so hard and sales have been average in the UK, and in Canada, it's doing very good. However, we wanted to expand into Nigeria, and we came up with a strategy which was the pop up shop we did in Lagos recently. We had our wares on exhibition at a store, and it was really successful as we made close to a million Naira and that

makes up for the whole collection. Nigeria is a country where people always want the best, so we don't want to start here on a mediocre scale. We want to come into the country with a bang, so we are still doing some research on the market.

Are you back in Nigeria for good?

Yes, I am back for good, but I will still be travelling to Canada and UK to check on the brand, and other countries as well to source for fabrics because we get our fabrics from all over the world. I am also looking into other business ideas, and trying to start a fashion line of my own.

How would you rate the fashion consciousness of Nigerian youths compared to other countries like Canada and UK?

To be honest, it all boils down to the fact that Nigeria is a country where over 60% of the population live under a Dollar a day, so it's really going to be hard for them to want to buy into fashion. They just get anything that can cover their bodies, but for the percentage of people who are fortunate, I'll say their fashion sense is developing. It's getting better compared to what it was five to 10 years ago. We have a lot of designers that are coming up, and have great ideas.

How expensive or affordable would you say your products are?

Due to the fact that we manufacture in Canada, we have to factor in the cost of getting them down to Nigeria. For the fact that we also sell in UK and Canada, we can't come to Nigeria and sell at an unreasonable price, so the prices of ourT- shirts go in the range of N11,000 and N15,000, while our hats go for about N7,000 to N10,000. Our wares area little bit cheaper here than in the UK and Canada.

Considering the peculiar nature of Nigeria, how do you intend to merge quality and affordability making sure that people are able to access quality materials?

We want to get to a point where we're moving a lot of units, so we'll be able to come to Nigeria and cut the price down for people knowing that our major market is in Canada and UK. We feel the youths in Nigeria need to experience Severe Nature.

How many artistes have you clothed?

We've worked with DJ Olu who is Davido's DJ, and he's a good friend of mine. We've also worked with Davido, Ice Prince, Leriq from Aristocrat Records, Burna Boy, LOS, and many more.

How was the experience like working with them?

To be honest, they are more exposed. They know about materials and designs. They actually feel that the designs are good, dope and affordable. They know they can't get the kind of stuff we sell in Nigeria unless they travel abroad. For example, we got to Davido through my friend DJ Olu; he had some pieces that I gave to him, and apparently David saw thern and really liked it and asked him where he got it from. In fact, he had to take it from Olu, and Olu asked me to get him new ones. That made me understand that it's not really about who owns the brand, but the brand speaks for itself through the quality and designs.

How would you rate the fashion sense of Nigerian artistes?

A couple of them are really exposed and they do more research so they really know how to match things, but some people are not as bothered about how they look because they have

other things they focus on. Artistes that I like their fashion sense include Wizkid, Ice Prince, and DRB.

If you were a Stylist, what are the things you would change about the fashion sense of Nigerian celebs?

I will let them know it's not really about what designers they wear, but how they can match whatever it is they are wearing. A lot of artistes wear heavy designers, but they don't match. That's why I really like Wizkid's sense of fashion. I think simplicity is key in fashion.

What does fashion mean to you?

I am more of a stylish person than a #ashionista because fashion changes while style is forever.

What is the most expensive item in your collection and what is the cheapest?

The most expensive item is the Severe Nature flannel which is like an elongated lumber jack design. We sold it for #15,000 in Nigeria, and in the UK, it goes for 50 Pounds, while it's 75\$ Canadian dollars in Canada.

Are you looking to partner with online retail outlets like Jumia and Kongo?

We are trying to develop our brand to the point that when we go to Jumia or Kongo, we will be able to negotiate prices that are reasonable. Right now, it's like we need their help; we want to get to a point where they will need our help before we conduct any business with them. The fact that we are an exclusive brand means you can't really get our designs anywhere else apart from with us.

Are you going to be working with any Nigerian designers?

No, I don't think so for now, because I feel our creative director is one of the best in the world. He comes up with ideas that no one can match.

Tell us about your girlfriend?

I don't have any girlfriend, I'm single. If I were to have a girlfriend, I don't think I can do anything perfectly for her because there are still other things that I'm focusing on, and if I'm focusing on other things, it will be like I'm cheating on her. I think the foundation of my life is very important, and I don't want to be distracted.

How do you relax?

I go out with friends. I have some girls that I see and we go out for lunch but I really don't have a girlfriend.

What's your advice to other young entrepreneurs like yourself?

I will say they should be fearless because nothing is too big. Never let anybody tell you that any idea is too big, that you can't do it.

What's the unique selling point of Severe Nature?

Our passion, and the need to express creativity through different forms of art is our unique selling point. And the fact that we only deal with nature-themed designs.

For two weeks my strength has failed me to write this I keep procrastinating. Not knowing what to write nor where to start.

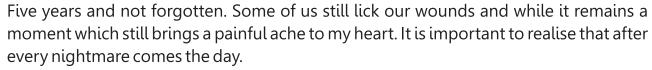
For anyone reading this may you not loose any of your children in Jesus name. No one should experience it.

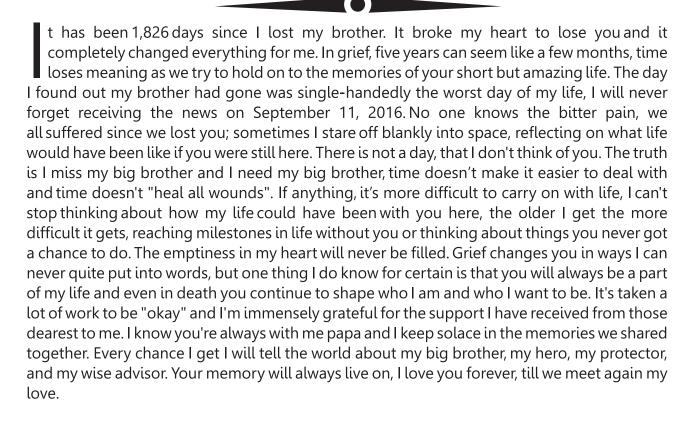

THE JOURNEY SO FAR...

Prince Michael Atobatele Foundation was launched on Dec. 11, 2016 after the passing unto glory of Prince Michael on Sept. 11, 2016.

Uzii, was a stylish and fashionable young man who developed interest in so many things, fashion being one of them. While in school at the University Of HERTFORDSHIRE in the United Kingdom with some of his friends, Serve Nature brand was born.

Shortly before he left, Gramspot was launched too. Michael meant different things to different people. To some he is a fashion buff.

To some, a power dresser;
To some, a great entrepreneur;
To some, a motivator;
To some, a friend with broad shoulders;
To some, a football (MAN U) lover;
To some, a music lover — we could go on and on.

He graduated with combined honours in Business and Human Resources Management.

The foundation started SDG (Sustainable Development Goal) which focused on zero hunger. Due to this, we visited motherless babies' homes to give them all the materials on the list they sent. We went to Kano Street to distribute food packs shortly after he passed on. He had it in view to visit the particular home we went to on the 1st of October; we gave food bags to the widows numbering 50.

The inaugural football competition to celebrate Prince Michael's posthumous birthday was held on June 23, 2017 as the first edition.

1st Edition

Season 1 was between Mind Builders school and Dansol High School. Michael Babatunde had his primary school education at Mind builders school. And it was our first outing at the tournament and Dansol won the cup.

2nd Edition

Season 2, which 4 Schools were participating, the Schools are Unique Heights High School, Nigerian - Turkish International School, Ronik Comprehensive School and Caleb International College. The 3rd Place Match between Unique Heights High School and Caleb International College ended by 7 - 4 in favour of Unique Heights High School. While the



Nigerian - Turkish International School defeated Ronik Comprehensive School in the Final by 5 - 2 to become the Champion of the Season 2 PMAF Cup.

3rd Edition

16 Schools were registered for the Season 3 of PMAF Cup. The 3rd Place was won by Homat Pivotal College after defeating Nigerian - Turkish International School by 5 - 2, while the Final Match between Caleb International College and Landmark College ended 7 - 5 in favour of Caleb International College.

4th edition

But for Covid we could not hold the match but we had an outreach where food & other items were distributed to the public we fed over 500 people during pandemic. We randomly made food and distributed it wherever we noticed the need for it, we also gave out brand PMAF face mask and hand sanitizer.

5th edition

Only 4 Schools participated in the season 5 of PMAF cup because of the pandemic, they are Defending Champion Caleb International College, Ronik Comprehensive School, Landmark College, and Homat Privotal College.

Landmark College defeated Ronik Comprehensive School in the 3rd place match by 5-3 in a penalty shootout, while Homat Privotal lost to Caleb International College 5-6 by penalty shootout, so Caleb International College won the trophy back to back.

The first year memorial service was held at GOLDEN GATE Ikoyi, after which we made a visit to Uzii's resting place at Ebony Vaults, Ikoyi.

The Empowerment summit was held on Sept 13; it was tagged BEYOND EDUCATION. The summit is about equipping the participants with tools with which they can use to develop their skills and be the best they can.

Yearly, 30 units of sewing machines & starter packs are distributed to skilful youths who have gone through the fashion design training. A sewing competition is usually organized to determine the recipients.

September 2017 – 30 Youths were empowered from Women Development Centre, Agege.

September 2018 – 30 Youth Corpers were empowered with sewing machines at NYSC Camp, Lagos.

September 2019 – 30 youths were empowered from Women Development Centre, Agege. (Fashion Designers)



September 2020 - 30 youths were empowered from Women Development Centre, Egbeda.

September 2021 - This set of students are from Women Development Centre, Egbeda. Being the 5th year anniversary we are empowering 50 youths:

20 youths for fashion designing;

15 youths for catering;

15 youths for barbing;

The competition keenly contested by 85 students and 50 of them finally scaled through and will be empowered by PMAF.

The foundation has paid some school fees and still does till date. We have remained committed to helping people in our community and Nigeria at large.

To keep Prince Michael's memory alive, we shall continue to hold all our annual activities. As at this September, we have been able to empower 180 youths and by the special grace of God, it will grow bigger.

The passion and love of Uzii gave birth to the foundation and we shall keep the hope alive.

The foundation's appreciation and gratitude cannot be quantified.
